

The need of a proper registration of titles (more particularly of novels) has long been felt, and many authors have suffered from the want of such a register. The title to a book is property, and the law recognizes it as such; therefore it is as much the duty of the State to register it as it is the duty of the State to register the title to land. The matter has long been in the hands of the Stationers Company, and their action has not been satisfactory. This may partly be owing to the fact that they have no power to compel author or publisher to register, but the duty of making their books easy for consultation they have...
